The Story of Caring for Carers

Like most community groups, Caring for Carer began with one person's personal experience, vision, and the desire and energy to make a difference. In the early 1990's, Tini Gruner read a book in which the feelings associated with looking after a family member paralleled her own experience. The book was Ken Wilber's, "Grace and Grit". In caring for his young wife who had been diagnosed with a fast growing breast cancer he spoke of feelings of isolation, his need to share his experiences and the need for services to recognize what family caring meant and to provide better practical and emotional support.

Caring for Carers was born in 1995 after Tini placed and ad in the paper and held a public meeting just for carers. The response was such that carers decided to continue to meet. They met twice a month: one meeting to hare experiences and to provide support to one another; the second meeting to listen to a guest speaker from a background relevant to their needs. Once the group got underway, it became evident that not only were carers' needs complex, but those who attended the meetings was just the tip of the iceberg. Most carers were so engrossed in their roles as carers that they barely had time to attend to their own needs, let alone attend meetings. These early members wanted to reach out to others to let them know that a helping hand and a sympathetic ear were not far away. As a result, the group became an incorporated society in 1996 and thus eligible for funding, This was duly applied for and in Jan. 1997, Caring for Carers opened its doors and employed it first professional staff.

Looking back it is clear that Caring for Carers has developed by responding to the needs of its members as well as responding to the issues and concerns expressed in those early days. Today, Caring for Carers employs three staff. They consist of the CHCH Social Worker, CHCH Service Co-ordinator/Office Manager and the Timaru Field Worker. The work includes:

- -Providing a monthly newsletter to keep carers up to date with what is available to them and a point of contact for those who are unable to attend social gatherings or attend meetings.
- -Monthly Support Group meetings are hosted by Caring for Carers in the city, Rangiora, Amberly, Ashburton, and Timuaru. Work is continuing to develop other areas.
- -A Monthly meeting in the City is being trialed as an opportunity to hear various speakers from other agencies.
- Four Carers' Days Out" a year provide a Spring and Autumn Outing for CHCH members. Ashburton and Timaru Carer members also get a "Day Out" during the year.
- -Individual contact by the Social Worker and Field Worker is maintained with carers. That contact may involve a home visit, accompanying or supporting a carer in dealing with services, providing information, counselling or simply lending an understanding ear.
- Regular contact is maintained with community and government agencies in promoting awareness as to the needs of carers as well as alerting them to the services we provide.

Article Of Interest (con't)

As the services to individual carers has developed over the years, so has public awareness increased as to the role and value of informal caring in the overall delivery of health and disability support services. Caring for Carer continues to represent the needs of Canterbury carers in the "Carers' Alliance".
