For over 100 years, cbm (Christian Blind Mission) has worked alongside people with disabilities in some of the world's poorest communities — supporting access to healthcare, rehabilitation, mobility, and inclusion.

While our focus is global, our mission is local at heart: to see every person living with dignity, regardless of where they are or what they face.

In many low-income countries, people who experience limb loss have very limited access to mobility devices, rehab services, or safe surgery. A simple prosthesis can mean the difference between isolation and participation — especially for women, children, or people in rural communities.

cbm works with local partners to provide:

- Mobility aids like wheelchairs and prosthetics
- Access to rehabilitation and community support
- Inclusive education and employment opportunities
- Advocacy for accessibility and rights

Every programme is built with and for people with lived experience — because sustainable change must be shaped by those at the centre of it.
